

# A bold commitment to a just transition.

The **Indigenous Power & Light Fund for Energy Sovereignty** is a collaborative initiative established by the Alliance for Tribal Clean Energy, in partnership with the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, The Lemelson Foundation, the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation, and other leading philanthropies.

The Fund leverages the Alliance's expertise and its network of Tribal, federal, NGO, and industry partners to provide **just-in-time capital and technical support** to help Tribes complete essential energy projects and prevent at-risk infrastructure from stalling.

With federal funding for Tribal clean energy projects rescinded, the Fund has become both a **lifeline and a driver of long-term change**—bridging immediate gaps, supporting Tribal clean energy projects, and laying the groundwork for a just, resilient energy future. It enables Tribes to complete **community-scale infrastructure**, replace costly diesel with **clean, reliable power**, electrify homes and Villages for the first time, and bolster **essential facilities** like medical clinics, schools, and emergency shelters. These investments meet urgent needs while advancing energy sovereignty and lasting well-being for Native communities across the U.S., including Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico.

**Above all, the Fund brings hope where hope is often in short supply.**

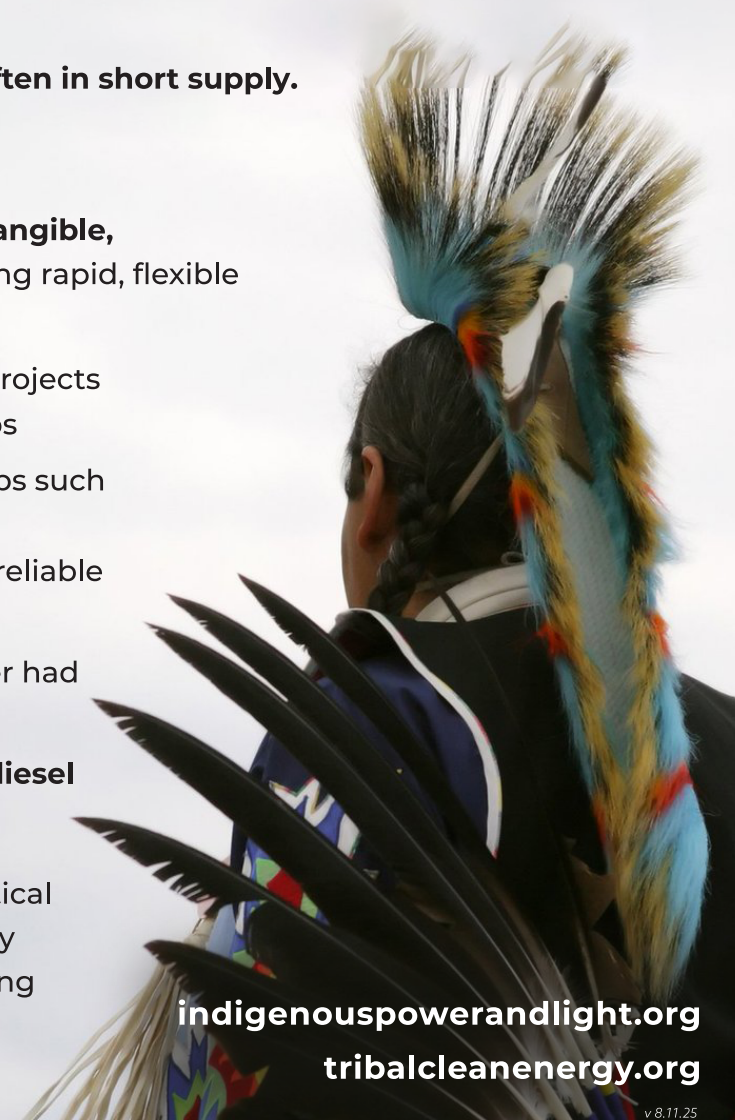
## Impact

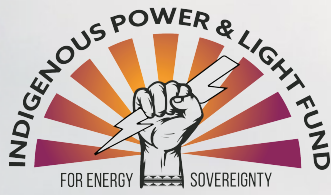

- **Complete** critical community-scale energy projects that would otherwise fail due to funding gaps
- Strengthen the **resilience of community** hubs such as health clinics, emergency shelters, and community centers by powering them with reliable renewable energy and battery systems
- **Electrify homes and Villages** that have never had access to power
- Replace **prohibitively expensive, polluting diesel** with clean, reliable systems

These timely investments are not only keeping critical projects from collapsing, they are delivering energy solutions that build a strong foundation for enduring energy self-determination in Native communities across the country.
